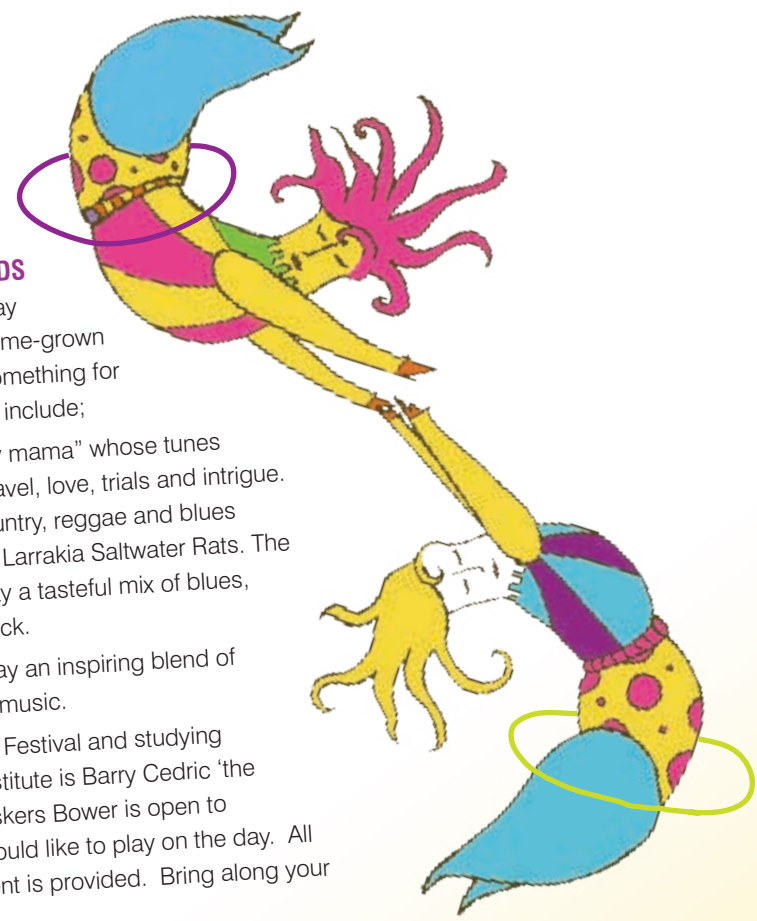
## COOMALIE SOUNDS
